THURSDAY, JANUARY 10, 2013

ASSIGNMENT: CELEBRATIONS (PROJECTED)

THURSDAY, MARCH 14, 2013

ASSIGNMENT: LESS IS MORE (PRINT)

You will receive two points for each entry in the Assigned topic, and one point for entries in the Open and Creative categories. You may submit only ONE (l) entry per category.

CELEBRATIONS: How do you and your camera capture "Celebrations"? Parties, graduations, births, victories, grand openings, award ceremonies, special holidays--they happen all the time. Use your best photography skills, work with the lighting, shoot from different

angles, let the image speak for itself and tell the story. Celebrate the shot!

LESS IS MORE: This is a theme about minimalism--the art of spareness and purity. Winning photos will reveal the beauty of a subject stripped down to its most basic form and context. Your goal will be to capture the essence of something, to express the best aspects of a subject with minimum content and maximum simplicity--a single leaf floating on a pond, a small child in a large and empty room, a footprint in the sand.

VICTORIA DYE TO JUDGE IN JANUARY

Our judge at the January 10 meeting will be Victoria Dye. Victoria is an award-winning photographer located in the Charlottesville area. Starting with film and the traditional 'wet' darkroom, she switched to the digital darkroom in 1999 and since 2003 has gone primarily digital, from capture to print.

Victoria has served several times as judge and presenter at CCC meetings, and was a member of the jury that selected images to be included in a CCC exhibit. She also conducted a course on Lightroom for the club.

Victoria teaches several courses in photography and photo processing at PVCC from which many club members have benefited. She began teaching digital classes in 2003 to help people understand, use and enjoy the vast creative potential that is available through digital media. From buying and using a digital camera to setting up and using a digital darkroom, Victoria can help you. Her classes cover a broad range of topics such as choosing the right camera, using digital editing and software, and setting up your own digital darkroom.

ERWIN BOHMFALK TO SPEAK AT NEXT MEETING

The program in January will be presented by Dr. Erwin Bohmfalk. Erwin is a resident of Waynesboro and started the Purple Foot restaurant there more than thirty years ago. When you visit the Purple Foot, you will see that the walls are covered with photos of his latest adventures; they have included Antarctica, Africa, Mongolia, Russia above the Arctic Circle, and many more exciting places. Dr. Bohmfalk is Chairman of the Board for the Wildlife Center of Virginia. He leads two-week photo safaris to Botswana and South Africa that are sponsored by the Center. In his presentation, he will be sharing his experiences as a passionate wildlife enthusiast, world traveler and photographer.
