

In the past Jon has expected a high standard of photography from us. A few interesting comments from his visit in February, 2012—he

tries to shoot as cleanly as possible when the subject is not moving, and he can take time to compose his shot; he often suggested that photographers crop in, and eliminate little bits and pieces that don't add to the image; the center of a photo is compositionally a dead spot; color is an emotional medium while black and white is an intellectual medium, because you have to think about it; he looks for layers, front to back; if you have good light, you are painting with it.

Wider View/'Scapes: Impressive wide open areas can be very pleasing to the eye. This is a topic that will encourage you to look at the wider picture. Use of a wide angle lens forces one to try and capture a larger area. This can include anything from a pastoral scene with rolling hills to a harbor with a cityscape reflected in the image. One may also focus on seascapes or any other 'scapes where the wide angle

view gives the photographer a large expanse to capture. A stitched together panorama is also a possibility. In either case, use of a tripod will really help the photographer frame the photo as well as keep the horizon line horizontal. Don't forget to think about including a close—and in-focus—foreground in your scenes.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ANNUAL END OF THE YEAR COMPETITION IN DECEMBER

(Please read this carefully. This will also be posted on the website.)

For the first three awards listed below, there will be one class, including both A and B photographers. A member may enter **one** image in each category. All entries must have been entered in a monthly competition in the same format during the current activity year. A member submitting an image in the end of the year contest **must have entered at least three monthly competitions during the prior year.** Digital projections should be entered in the same format they were submitted for the monthly competitions.

CATEGORIES OF AWARDS

- 1. Best Print from any Assigned or Open entry, either color or monochrome, entered during the calendar year as a matted print.
- Best Digital Projection from any
 Assigned image, entered during the year as a digitally projected image.
- 3. Best Creative Digital Projection image.

The following awards will also be announced and/or judged during the evening.

4. Rothman Photographer of the Year: In memory of Howard Rothman, one of the founding members of the CCC, this award is presented to the Class A photographer who has accumulated the

highest number of points during the year.

- 5. Class B Photographer of the Year: This award is presented to the Class B photographer who has accumulated the highest number of points during the year.
- 6. Shyan Award: This award, in memory of Ted and Rita Shyan, founding members of the CCC, is open only to Class B *photographers*. The photographer enters three prints that must have been taken in the current year, and **may or** may not have been entered in a competition. (Images that were entered as digital projections may be used, but must be submitted as matted prints.) Color or monochrome may be entered. These prints should be the three that the photographer considers his or her best work; they do not necessarily have to be part of a theme or a type, but they may if the photographer wishes to present them in that manner. The judge will consider the overall skills of the photographer based on these three images.

If photos are entered for both the Shyan Award and the Outstanding Image of the Year, separate prints must be entered for each category.

After the November meeting, Anne Scott will compile a list of the number of entries and all earned points, for all members. This will be emailed to each of you. Please check your name carefully if you are entering the competition. Photos must be entered in the same format as they were during the year with the exception of the Shyan Award; if you have not entered at least three times in the past year, you are not eligible to enter.

All certificates, prizes, etc., will be presented at the January meeting.

His years as a game warden and a park ranger enabled him to give us information about the animals and the specific environmental problems they are facing. As a judge Ken was specific in his critiques, had many positive comments, and held us to a high standard—5 points were awarded only a few exceptional images.

I have a couple of questions I want to raise to the membership that need attention from us as a group – "Where do we go from here?"

Over the past several months many of you have expressed your feelings and thoughts regarding the issue of whether or not "all assigned images", both "A" and "B", should be submitted for judging by "projection" as opposed to the current procedure we now use? It is a fair question and will be discussed at the Executive Committee's upcoming meeting on November 6. There are many "pros" and "cons" regarding

this issue and they deserve a full blown airing, not only at the Executive Committee level, but by the full membership as well. Timing will be crucial as to when such a change, if adopted, could be implemented. I feel reasonably certain that a motion will come from our next Executive Committee meeting to bring this matter to the floor for full discussion and a vote. You will be kept informed either by an announcement at our November 13th meeting and/or "email".

Another issue that continues to receive considerable comment is whether or not the "Creative" and "Open" Categories should be combined or changed in some other way. This is a tough one and has had some discussion at the Executive Committee level but, to date, no decision has been reached. Again, this matter is somewhat tricky and quite simply needs a full blown discussion of the "pros" and "cons" and just how it could be easily implemented. Again, I personally feel that this one should be brought before the full membership for discussion and a vote as soon as possible. You will be fully informed as the status of this question, also.

I would ask each of you to take some time to give "studied" thought to both of these questions and develop your own thinking regarding them. And – feel free to discuss them with any board member. We're here to serve you. Further – please feel free to email your thoughts directly to me with the full assurance that they will be shared with our Executive Committee members. COOL TRICKS FOR GREAT PICS!


A dozen or so members showed up at the Northside Library on Tuesday, October 21, to observe Rob Fehnel and Gerry Bishop demonstrate some of their favorite home studio photo techniques.

Rob started off showing how to set up a clear dish of water, add oil drops to the surface to create a pattern, and then reflect colored light up through the mix using a remote flash unit. He then went on to demonstrate how to produce and photograph a rainbow-colored soap film made by dipping a wire frame into a mixture of dish soap, water, and glycerin. He also described how to create images with beautiful "bokeh"—bright spots of light in the background of an image that have been softened by use of a shallow depth of field.

Gerry followed by showing a tabletop setup for shooting small objects backlit by remote flash units. He also showed how to "tether" a laptop to the camera for immediate viewing, evaluation, and adjustment of images as they're captured.

SPECIAL WORKSHOP NIK SOFTWARE TRAINING CLASS

Have you heard about NIK Software? Many CCC members have found this suite of programs very helpful in processing their photos. It includes highly regarded programs for adjusting tone and color, creating black and white images, sharpening images, and dealing with high-contrast scenes by using "high-dynamic range" techniques.

A one-day class on the NIK programs will be taught by Brian Zwit. Brian taught the very successful class on Lightroom for us two years ago. He is a full-time professional instructor for the School of Digital Photography in Sterling, VA and has judged and presented programs at CCC. His classes are very well organized and clearly presented.

The class will be held in the classroom at ACAC on Rt. 29 North, Thursday, February 12 from 9 to 5. The class size is limited to 15. The cost of the class is expected to be about \$60 per person. Lunch can be purchases at the ACAC food court or in other restaurants in the area. Brian will also be the judge and the speaker at the regular CCC meeting that will follow the class.
